#### **HOW DESPERATE ARE YOU FOR BREAD?**

Luke 11:3, 5-13 "Give us day by day our daily bread."

The Lord put a thought on my mind a few weeks ago. How desperate are you for bread? Jesus, in Matthew 6 and Luke 11, teaches His disciples to pray, what we call, "The Lord's Prayer". Jesus starts with, "Our Father in heaven..." then, "... give us this day our daily bread." Immediately after this teaching on what to pray and ask for, Jesus goes right into this story (Luke 11) about a man who has an unexpected visitor come to his door at night. The man is desperate to give his visitor some bread.

NOTE: this parable starts a midnight. In the scriptures, "at midnight' often refers to the coming of the Lord. It is a reminder to us that Jesus is coming back. Jesus is teaching that our action (knocking) is based on the earlier verses 1-4. One priority needs to be prayer. To be seeking God. So, Jesus goes from teaching on prayer, to immediately teaching a parable of a friend who is knocking on his neighbor's door at the midnight hour.

Jesus says to get desperate, start knocking on the door. Get ready, be prepared to help people. Have bread ready. Be filled so you can give out. Start waking people up. The church is falling asleep. Start

waking up your brothers and sisters, wake up your friends. Make them aware of the reality that Jesus is coming back. No one knows the time, and a visitor might just show up.

Question: Are you are running low on bread for yourself? Do you have bread for those who might be coming to your house? This man in the parable is desperate for bread. He needs something to give the people who are came to his door. How desperate are you for God? He is the Living Bread. How is your daily bread supply? Are you even aware that you have run out of bread? The man in this parable/story did not even know he had no bread until the guest showed up. I asked this question of myself but also to my church. Are you aware of what food, or bread is left in YOUR house? Are you aware that you have no bread left to give to those who are hungry for God. No food to sustain those searching for life. No life to give them because you are empty inside. What do you have for those who are hungry for answers?

BE FILLED

SO YOU CAN GIVE OUT.

Look at what Jesus said in verse 8. The man did not give bread to the one knocking because he was his friend. Why did the man in the house


give him the bread? The man gave his neighbour the bread because of HIS PERSISTENCE (NKJV). The New International Version translates it as, "because of your shameless audacity". Things will begin to change in your life when you do not care anymore about yourself or what people think. The important thing becomes when you care more about souls and care about your spirit man.


God often waits for our passionate 'persistence' in prayer. It is not that God is reluctant and needs to be persuaded. Sometimes He just wants to see your passion. See that you care about others who need

help, and you are praying for them to get it. Our persistence does not change God; it changes us. Persistent and passionate prayer develops in us a heart and passion for what God wants. That is why we need to PRAY. That is why we need to KNOCK. Knock and it shall be given. Seek and you will find. The church needs to be knocking on Heaven's doors. Desperate for Jesus, desperate for His Presence. Hungry for the Word to touch you. Hungry for the Word to fill you and satisfy you again.

Are you aware your bread is gone or gotten low in your life? IF YES - are you persistent enough in your prayers? Do you care if you might disturb others who are comfortable in their life. Do you have audacity to press in? Can you declare, "I DON'T CARE - what people think."? People's lives are at stake. How desperate are you that you would say, "Get out of my way, I am hungry for God. I have nothing, but I am desperate for a fresh infilling. Get out of my way - I need bread. I need Jesus, The Living Bread."

What is your vision for the Harvest? The harvest of many souls. Right now, in Southwestern Ontario it is harvest time. Everywhere you drive






it is harvest time all around us. Wheat and barley just finished in August. Beans are being harvested as I type. The cornfields will be next. Everywhere you look, in the natural, it is Harvest Time. So, it is in the Spirit realm too.


All around us people are searching for truth. All around us people want what is real. All around us people search for a living, true, powerful, life-giving God. Bread that will feed their hungry soul. Bread that will satisfy the aching in their hearts. Bread that will satisfy the emptiness they feel inside. Think of this in verse 6, friends on a journey have come and the owner realizes he has nothing to offer them. The man was empty of life. He was empty of the Word. Empty of the Holy Spirit. He had run out and he was low on God's touch. He is desperate to have some bread in his life and for others. I have to find some bread. I am knocking on Heaven's door. I am asking for you to give me bread. Do not let my friends die. I need bread.

Let the Word come alive in me again. Let the Spirit of God come alive in me today. If you do not have God inside of you, then you cannot give it to your friends. If you have not any life, they are not going to like what is offered them.

Right now, it feels like it is time for Jesus to come back. Today I ask you - I ask myself, are you in a position of prayer? Are you taking inventory and checking to see, have I run out of bread? You all know Jesus is coming back. It has been written in His Word. No one, no one knows when. But as shown here in this story, be ready. Are you hungry? Be filled, get filled up. Get the bread of Heaven into you. We




praying again like it matters.



Help me God. Help me to give me food for the lost searching. Help me God, to have compassion for the harvest. There are people all around me that need Jesus. God give me fresh bread, a fresh touch so I can help others. God let me help those who have no life left in them.

Many are on life's journey searching for bread - for new life. Notice in the parable it says, "friends". They are people outside of God's family. Get a burden for souls and ask for extra bread so you have extra heavenly provisions to give out to those looking for life. We need to pray we have life in us. Knock in an audacity that gets Heaven's attention. Knocking and praying for life and for bread. IT IS HARVEST TIME!

There is an ongoing moan in the spirit realm right now. We need to



be knocking, being loud, and vigilant. Knocking, seeking, Praying. WAKE UP CHURCH, God is coming back and soon. Get an urgency for the for those who are worn out. Worn out in the church and worn out in society. Dying from no sustenance. We must have bread to give out to those who are coming to our doors. We have bread to give out - Jesus is the bread of life. He is the hope for the world. He is the hope for those wandering. For those who are lost. Those who have no hope, or life left in them.

Jesus loves you. Jesus saves. Jesus can break addictions and deliver you out of your pit. Be desperate for Him and for the bread of life and be ready to share that bread with others.

#### GREETING TO YOU IN THE NAME OF JESUS!

At our IAOGI National Convention in Burlington in May, I was elected as the new Secretary/Treasurer. I follow in the footsteps of David Ellyatt who held this position for 36 years and has been involved in the fellowship for over 58 years, so far. We thank David for all the hard work that he did, for many years without any pay at all.

I wanted to tell you a little bit about myself. For those that don't know me, I am Jack Skafte. My first name is actually Eyvind, (which is Danish and pronounced like Ivan with a "d" on the end). I was born and raised in Cornwall, ON. At the age of 17, I was led to the Lord by my uncle, Jake Turksma (who became Regional Secretary for the East Coast and Assistant General Secretary) on the day that he was ordained by Ward Trotter in Apsley, ON, on Sept. 12<sup>th</sup>, 1976.



On Jan. 6, 1979, I married my best friend's sister, Karen Bateman. We had started going out in the spring of '78 then 3 months later we got engaged (just after she got saved) and then married 6 months after that. In May of '79, we left on a 2½ month bicycle tour of England, Netherlands, Germany, and Denmark.

After 2 years in Cornwall, we decided to move to Nova Scotia. We joined the Living Word Fellowship (the church Jake pastored) so that I could study under him because I felt called to the ministry. During the next 25 years, I learned a lot in all areas of ministry. I would preach while Jake was gone on vacation or preaching elsewhere. I also preached at another church that he pastored on occasion. At the same time, I was building my house, helping to build the church building next door to my house and working a full-time job as a printer.

Shortly after moving to Nova Scotia in '81, we started a Christian bookstore. We would set up book tables at 3 different Full Gospel Businessmen's meetings in the area every month. In 1991, I started a computer business that I ran for 10 years. Then in 2002, I started a cable contracting company (called Cable Jack Inc.) that is still running. My two oldest sons work for me in that business, installing phone, cable, and internet. Being involved in business for over 40 years has helped me in managing people and money. We had built our house and the church building mortgage free!





I was licensed by Jake in 2003. After Jake went to be with the Lord on Sept. 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2006, Rev. Paul McPhail came down for Jake's memorial service. The next day he ordained me and inducted me as pastor of the church, which I have now attended for 41 years and pastored for 16 years.

Over the last 16 years, I have been the Regional Secretary for Atlantic Canada and hosted the National Convention in Halifax in 2012. I have traveled up North to help build churches in Iqaluit, Kangursik and Labrador and preaching in those and other churches through an interpreter.

My wife, Karen, and I have 4 children and 8 grandchildren. Our desire is to help build up the body of Christ so that they can fulfil the call of God on their lives, and it is now my honour to do that within my new role as Treasurer.

#### **CONNECTION OF LOVE**

We were introduced to Pastor Alex in 2015 on our first mission trip to Cuba. It was at that time he told us that they would be opening a teen challenge in Holguin in 2017. In 2018 we went to see the Teen Challenge and bring supplies for the very first time. We were able to bring in a laptop as well as medications and clothing and shoes. In 2019 when we went back, Pastor Alex brought us to another place that he was hoping to open for women. They have that facility almost opened, but of course Covid-19 has slowed down the process. They do have a women's ministry going; (off-campus work) however,

they need to still do some needed work at the location. They have need to still build a wall for privacy from the public.

We want to share with you about gracious, Pastor Alex. He has a beautiful wife, daughter, and a son His mother-in-law lives with them as well. Pastor Alex not only heads Teen Challenge, but he also heads the chaplain ministry in Holguin and the prison ministry in Holguin.

The last three times we visited Cuba we brought food, medical supplies, toiletries, clothing, shoes, mosquito netting solar lighting, (many blackouts), and many more things. Richard and I have been going back to Cuba two times a year, and three times this year as we know the need is great. It has only been this past year that we have been able to bring food legally into Cuba. In January, we brought 200lbs of supplies. On April 2, more people came with us, thus allowing 400 lbs of supplies. Yet the needs are barely met.

Richard and I have been very blessed to be able to minister to many families, many churches, and to Teen Challenge over the past seven years. We are humbled that God has brought this to us. These past two times we saw people come to Jesus at the resort. Praise the Lord!

We could type and talk for hours on the trips we have taken to Cuba.









These are two pictures of graduation. We actually brought these gowns to them in 2019. They were donated by someone at the United Church in Wheatley. Pastor Alex is the man with the black mask on.

When we first found out about the need for this ministry in Cuba, we wondered why the need? Considering how poor everyone is. It became apparent. Alcohol is everywhere, no food but lots of booze. Along with this challenge is the overwhelming feeling of hopelessness that overcomes many men and women. If a person is working in Cuba, they are making only \$25. A month. This is to support their entire family.

This is a picture is of the staff members of Teen Challenge. All of the men are past students of Teen Challenge.

It's very easy to understand when a person has no hope, they need to do something. The gospel is met with many open arms in Cuba. When people are in such need and are presented with the Gospel of Jesus, many come to the Lord.

Richard and I have seen firsthand Jesus working through Pastor Alex and many other Pastors in Cuba. There is nothing better than to be offering hope, to the hopeless.




It's with great pleasure that we share the following with you:

As I type this letter I, Krista, am sitting in Durban, South Africa. It feels a bit strange being back after the last few years. A lot has happened and it has been great to reconnect with so many people.

When I booked my flights to come, I felt such an urgency to go. Even though my schedule was extremely busy we knew it was important. Shortly after booking, there was a break-in at our center in Durban. Many of the more expensive items were stolen: keyboard, sound system, laptops, printer; approximately \$4000.00 worth of equipment. It was incredibly heartbreaking. Thankfully no one was hurt. A couple of weeks later the tent, our large shelter at the center, was torn and destroyed by



Much of my time here has been spent teaching and helping with Administration. Philani was the leader we had trained to do most things and when he got sick, he lost a lot of memory and couldn't really help. Some things have not been kept up so the team is now working diligently to rebuild. Flooding this last year also destroyed some things.

Our feeding programs continue to operate along with the After School Programs. We are feeding as many as 400 a day between our two locations. I got the privilege of visiting each of the grannies that we assist as well.

The church is meeting at the school, for now, until a new tent or

shelter can be purchased. A new tent will cost approximately \$900.00 in Canadian funds. Yet this is not a deterrent to them! The passion with which they pray and worship God is beautiful and it has been a blessing to share the Word of God with them while I'm here and to encourage them. Please continue to pray for them. May God assist them as they rebuild and grow in their new roles.

#### THE PLIGHT OF WIDOWS IN INDIA

The plight of an approximately 40 million widows (about the population of Canada) in India is overwhelming. Kell and Lorri witnessed firsthand the form of torture these women face as they wander in rags like feral humans. When their husbands die, the widow is considered to be the cause of his death. Because of that, she is not looked after and often faces incredible cruel exploitation of women in this very dark religion.

Widows are considered a financial strain on the family and become outcasts, shunned by both family and society. Their very existence, even seeing their face in the morning, can be considered a curse, a bad omen that should be removed from the family. Among the brahmins and some higher castes, the widow's heads are shaved, and they are made to wear red or white saris without ornaments; they are expected to eat only a

single meal. Their presence at family public functions is totally forbidden. All of this forces them to live in decrepit ghettos, often forced to beg, plead, and sleep on pavement.

Only qualified widows receive a very small government pension. About 28% of widows could receive government support but only 11% do. Many of these widows served as caregivers for their families so they never developed marketable trades. Various social reformers and a few government facilities try to support widows by providing employment training and some medical treatment, but not nearly enough.

Those are just the physical needs of these widows. This does not even begin to address the immense emotional, social, and spiritual needs of these neglected women. "It is a 'love necessity' for the church to deal with this," says Kell. This situation presents a great open door to bring not only protection but Christ to these women. Mother Teresa was right in quoting Jesus. "If you do this to these the most vulnerable you are doing it unto me."

#### GRACE LIFE MINISTRIES REACH OUT

In 2021 Grace Life Ministries (GLM) started identifying and rescuing destitute widows in Odisha specifically the Kandhamal district, noted as having been the poorest district in India. It was also the centre of the worst persecutions of Christians in the history of the church in India, as recently as in 2008. That year, 100,000 believers lost all their homes, their churches, and their ministry centres. This atrocity caused universal



intercession throughout the Christian world.

As a result, the government stepped in providing good roads and policing; rebuilding all that was destroyed. Because of this persecution, God now has a very dedicated church that is very loyal to him and is fearless despite persecution. Many churches have been started and God is moving mightily with these courageous believers. The churches are naturally very loving and kind spirited.

Throughout Odisha there are various groups of wandering, destitute widows who are homeless and without family support. They are in rags, often hungry and without shelter caused by poverty and negative family circumstances.

We believe it is our responsibility to identify true destitute widows and make sure they are loved and cared for. In three villages that GLM is involved with, we have identified 13 women who need help. We make sure they have a safe place to stay and that they have a proper dry place to live. We provide clothes, blankets, beds, food, and medical aid. We ensure they are well taken care of and loved.

James tells us in 1:27 "That pure and undefiled religion before God the Father is to look after widows and orphans in their distress." The believers are very happy to do this very great ministry, understanding it is a very great privilege to do the Lord's work in this way.




#### RECLAIMED!

We knew who we were, our role and place in all of creation. At the height of colonization, our people witnessed a people who didn't see us as a people, nor understood our relationship with Creator God.

As the pages of time unraveled hidden mysteries of God's plan and purpose, we understood our destiny. We knew of God's love for us and He had a plan to redeem us. We knew a Savior was born, died for our sin, and was raised from death for our salvation. We knew whoever believed its message will experience forgiveness of sins, peace of mind, love for all men, power over sin, and a living hope of eternal life.
