FROM THE DESK OF OUR GENERAL SECRETARY

GREETINGS TO YOU MY BROTHERS AND SISTERS IN THE LORD,

May God bless you abundantly this Fall and into the holiday season with His Presence and Love. The Lord is moving and doing great things. All over the world God is showing HE IS ALIVE!

HE IS GOD IN THE STORMS!

1 Corinthians 15:13 -14 "Watch, stand fast in the faith, be brave, be strong. Let all that you do be done with love."

It is interesting that Paul wrote this verse just after verse 9, "For a GREAT and effective door has opened to me..." Awesome, a great door is open for ministry; an invitation for me to go and share the gospel and for Holy Spirit to move. Yet the last part of the verse is like many we read in the book of Acts, 'and there are many adversaries.' So, I encourage you today, like Paul there are many opportunities to share the gospel, work in our communities, and work around the world. However, there will be obstacles. Good news! Jesus is the Victor and Overcomer!

I am here today to remind you; God is in the boat! Do not despair, just open your eyes and look! He is in the boat. He is our protector; He is our deliverer. He will keep you and protect you. Do not lose heart, Jesus is in the boat with you!

In these dark times, Paul writes to us reminds us, "For it is God who commanded light to shine out of darkness, to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God.... We have THIS TREASURE in earthen vessels." (2 Cor. 4:6-7) Praise the Lord! We have Holy Spirit living in us. "We are hard pressed on every side, YET not crushed, we are perplexed, but not in despair, persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed." (2 Cor 4:8)

Everyone wants to be like the church in the book of Acts and to see the miracles, and the lame man walk all the time. However, we are quick to forget that in the days of Acts there was persecution, THEN salvations. Paul and Peter were beaten, but healings came forth. Leaders put in prison and whipped, then revival breaks out. In the midst of darkness God commanded the light to shine.

In these last days, be in the Word. It is your rudder in the storm. In the storms, be a person of prayer, it is your communication with the Heaven. Speak in tongues; it is your direct line to the Commander and

Chief of Heaven. The Lord of Hosts; that is the leader you want on your side. That is the leader you want to be in communication with. That is the one leader who you need to have speaking into your ear, KNOW HIS VOICE

Storms are coming and storms are here, and storms go. Thank God He put in His Word countless examples of deliverance and protection in dangerous situations. God still today delivers and protects today.

In Acts 27 & 28 Paul was on his way to Rome, and Paul hit a storm. His plan was moving ahead and was working, yet but he still ended up in a storm. I am here to remind you that in the midst of the storm God has a plan. Storms may try to blow you off course and alter how "you thought" things may go. Storms will test your faith, BUT God still speaks to you in the storm! God will walk with you in the storm, and He will protect you in the storm, and storms will end.

Prophetic Word: Just believe His promises and hang onto Him as your anchor. For there will be times of buffeting, there will be times of testing. Look, what you hold dear may be crushed (in the natural), But God will preserve you! You may have tough decisions ahead. Decisions of letting go of what you or others may think holds value. But as you let it go - it will end up saving your soul. It is a season or a time of testing, and of letting go of what you hold as important in your life. But GOOD NEWS - God steers your boat and your life. Good news, He will up gird you. Good news, even when you are in some terrible storms and death would seem imminent - You have a Word. Hold fast to it like Paul did. You may have a spoken Word; trust the Word, speak the Word. Because in the storm that only thing coming out is His people who know Him and trust His Word (says the Lord).

But thanks be to God WHO GIVES US THE VICTORY THROUGH OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST. Therefore: my beloved brethren, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that your labour is not in vain.' (1 Cor 15:57-58)


I am here to remind you that like Paul, like Peter, David, Moses, and many others God will keep you, and God will preserve you in the storms. Promotion lays ahead - PAST THE STORM. In the midst of the storm Paul heard God speak. God won't leave you. He won't abandon you. The enemy for sure is whispering that into your ear or your heart, BUT REMEMBER GOD IS FAITHFUL!

Interesting to note - it is not Paul's fault he is in this shipwreck. It was someone else's decision that put him in harm's way. Here someone else chooses NOT to listen to the Word of God. Someone might be

making decisions that affect your life, but God

redeems!

In Acts 27, 28 Paul goes through a series of storms BUT GOD WAS WITH HIM. In the midst of the storm, in the midst of uncertainty and of loss you will find that God is still there. And He will get you through safely. You might feel stretched, terrified, tried, and tested. If you want to survive a shipwreck, you must hang onto a promise as Paul did. In verse 22 Paul said, 'there will be no loss of life.' Trust God - believe God. Even in the storms GOD STILL SPEAKS.



You survive storms and shipwrecks when you ALL HANG OUT TOGETHER. The soldiers tried to leave the boat and Paul said NO. God has a principle. Stick together through the storm. UNITY IS IMPORTANT. Your words can exhort, can encourage others.

Remember, God doesn't deliver you from a storm and a shipwreck, to have you die on the beach! (Acts 28) God had another plan, and it was for salvation and healing to be brought to that island. Trust God in the storm. Trust God's Word.

Romans 8:11 "If that same Spirit that raised Christ from the dead dwells (lives) in you - it shall quicken (bring life) your mortal - human body." God's Holy Spirit changes everything. It will change your storm. It will take that which was going to bring death and give life. God did not send His Son so you would die, but Jesus came to give life, and life MORE ABUNDANTLY... even in storms.

Trust Him in the storm. Look to Jesus, not to the world. Look to Jesus, not at the circumstances. Look to Jesus, for your Redeemer Lives!

In these last days THE CHURCH WILL GROW AND PROSPER. We will be the answer to the world's problem (not us but He who lives in us!). Be the light. Be the one who hears God and does what He says.

FROM THE DESK OF OUR ASSISTANT GENERAL SECRETARY

Good day dear brothers and sisters,

As I write these lines, I'm on the Island of Margarita in Venezuela, where we've been on mission for our Lord since August 16. Our journey began in the Dominican Republic, then took us to Colombia and now Venezuela. We've had a series of meetings where we've seen the hand of our Lord Jesus work mightily, and now we're getting ready for Margarita Island where I'll be celebrating the 106th anniversary of Ebenezer Church. Our journey will end in the city of Puerto Ordaz.

What's special about this trip is that when the doors opened for Venezuela, I was made aware that the majority of people there live on a salary of around \$30 a month, and bread costs the same as it does here! I prayed to the Lord and asked Him to confirm that He was indeed sending me there by giving me enough money to feed all the people in all the churches we would visit in Venezuela. After asking people to unite with me in prayer to have the necessary



finances, I am so grateful to our God who when He gives a vision He also gives the provision so that in just over 3 weeks we have raised over \$20,000 and so far we have fed over 1,500 people and by the













end of the trip we expect to have fed around 10,000 in addition to sharing the good news of the Kingdom of God with them. So far, we've had several testimonies of people being healed, and a few hundred people have given their lives to Jesus.

GLORY TO JESUS!

We've had some difficult travel conditions, being caught up in hurricane Franklin in the Dominican Republic, problems with accommodation and transport, and lots of other things that make us grateful to the Lord for what we've got.

In Colombia the pastors were so struck by the teaching on Faith and finances in the Kingdom of God that they asked me to return in October, so I'll be back the last weekend of October in Colombia for a seminar for leaders and pastors on Faith, tithes, and offerings.

WHAT A GREAT GOD WE SERVE!

We're also praying for another big tour to Venezuela in February, all because of our God who works wonders.

I include a few photos of our trip and ask you to keep us in prayer. May our God bless and multiply his great grace on you and especially on those who support us with your prayers and seeds, thank you for being part of this work.

"I feel that God wants me to visit the ministers in Newfoundland and Northern BC." This is what Dave Kelsey told me when he got elected as

General Secretary. Last year Dave and I together with my wife, Karen went to Newfoundland to visit the ministers there. It had been 30 years since a Board Member had been to "The Rock." It was a great visit, and we have some articles in The Mantle by Shirley Noseworthy as a direct result of this visit.

This past July, I flew from Halifax and Dave was supposed to fly from London, but his flight was cancelled because of weather so Air Canada sent him by taxi to Toronto. We arrived in Prince George together at midnight but that was 4 am to me. The next morning, we met up with Arlo Johnson for brunch, who was Regional Secretary for Northern BC until 2008. It was great to hear his stories of how he started in the ministry and all the places he ministered in his 66 years of pastoral ministry. He continues to be a mentor at the age of 91.

Next, we met up with Doug and Marnie Phair. They are Christian country musicians, who pastor a house church called Adullam's Cave in their home. They truly have a heart for their people and the lost. Marnie has been with the IAOGI for several years and now Doug is considering joining also.



Lastly, we took a ferry from Prince Rupert to Lax-Kw'alaams to visit 4 ministers at the First Nations reservation there. We stayed with Eddie & Karen Knott who also run a bed & breakfast. They are the pastors of the Port Simpson Native Revival Centre along with Darlene Dudoward and Bertha Ryan. They minister to a large portion of the reservation and host a number of events that fill their church. The needs on the reservation are many and Eddie and Karen work hard to meet those needs both physical and spiritual.

I drove a total of 1600 kms from Prince George to Prince Rupert. We had heard reports of wildfires in the area before arrived in BC, but the day we landed, it rained, and the fires had been greatly reduced. We never saw any fire or smoke. Praise the Lord!

We flew back together to Vancouver. I got a direct flight to Halifax and was there 5½ hours later, but Dave was stuck in Vancouver because his flight was cancelled, He finally reached home 24 hours later. It was a long trip but was a blessing to us and the ministers that we were able to fellowship with.

God is moving and ministering through people across our nation. Blessings,

EZRA CANADA - MINISTRY REPORT FROM UKRAINE

I am the Founder/Executive Director of Ezra Canada. A ministry that Rescues, Returns and Restores God's Chosen people back to their Promised Land from absolute poverty and persecution and deadly danger in the brutal war zone of Ukraine. I am happy to report that none of our staff or 200 volunteers have been killed or injured to date. Although they suffer severe deprivation from lack of electricity, water, and serious travel restrictions, they continue to help God's Chosen people to return to Israel, averaging 120-150 monthly.

We do this in fulfilment of **Isaiah 49:22**, where the Lord, speaking through the prophet, declares that He will use the Gentiles to return His people in these last days. That just happens to be you and me folks.

As we have approximately 40,000 Jews in our system at any given time, it takes a massive amount of organization, co-operation, and funding to locate missing documents, feed, house and supply medical attention to these precious people while they await 'repatriation' to their Promised Land.

One of the most common questions I receive regarding our ministry to the Jews is "What does Israel have to do with me?" or "What do I have to do with Israel?", "What's the big deal about Israel anyway?". My response is, *EVERYTHING!* If you are a Christian, everything about Israel and the Jews is critical to your walk with the Lord and understanding of Scripture.

Thus says the Lord God:

"Behold, I will lift My hand in an oath to the nations, And set up My standard for the peoples; They shall bring your sons in their arms, And your daughters shall be carried on their shoulders;

Galatians 3:29 says... "and if ye be in Christ, then are ye Abraham's seed and heirs according to the promise".

As a Christian, you are a 'spiritual' child of Abraham. I encourage you to do a study on the Abrahamic promises that you possess as an 'heir'.

Obadiah 1:16 says..."For the day of the Lord upon all nations is near; as you have done to Israel, so shall it be done unto you". In case you didn't recognize it, God has just threatened you, even if you simply ignore them.

Ezekiel 43:7 says...."Son of man, this Israel is the place of my throne and the place for the soles of my feet, where I will live among the people of Israel *FOREVER*". We have been invited to join God's Jewish family by accepting God's Jewish Son, Yeshuah (Jesus) Messiah.

Jesus was born a Jew, lived as a Jew, taught as a Jewish Rabbi, died as a Jew, and is coming back as a Jew to Jew-rusalem!

But, on the flip side



Genesis. 12:3, 27:29 and Numbers 24:9 promise to "bless those who bless you (Israel) and curse those who curse you...". What side of this Scripture do you want to be on?

Romans 15:27 commands us to pray for and support Israel and the Jewish people.

GRACE LIFE MINISTRIES - GROWTH AMID PERSECUTION

This is a challenging time for the church in parts of India. A main leader from North India contacted me recently to report that in Manipur in just 3 days over 300 churches were destroyed. This is a spiritual battle. It is a call for the worldwide church to pray, many have been martyred, women violated, and thousands displaced.

We weep with those who have lost their homes their loved ones and had to face incredible hardship. **Yet we have huge hope.** Paul says when he is weak when the trials of sufferings, weakness, troubles, and



insults come, **God's grace is sufficient** and thus when we are weak, He comes with His grace and makes us strong.

Our main leaders plus all their church congregations went through the worst persecutions ever in the churches' history in India in Odisha state in 2008. All their homes were destroyed as well as all the church buildings in this district. Many lost family members. I ministered to one brother who witnessed his wife murdered during this horrible time. Yet out of this, God raised a truly courageous powerful church! Again, the global church prayed, and God did answer. We see the results.

Paul declares in all these sufferings he experienced, "we are more than conquerors"!! The homes and churches have been rebuilt by the government and we are building many new ministry centers. New roads have been built plus there is now a much greater police protection. A number of hotels have also been built in the main town which has become a safe place to bring the many teams we have had visit the ministry, in recent years.



Jesus invites us in **Revelation 3:20,21** to suffer with Him in bringing the Kingdom so we may sit with Him on His throne to rule with Him just as in His victory He now sits with His Father on His throne. The true sacrifice of praise to God is the fruit of lips that openly profess His name **Hebrews 13:15**.



The church in Odisha is no longer nominal but they have become bold warriors for Christ a great example for all! A great many are continually coming to Christ with regular reports of whole families requesting baptism. As reported last news we have 11 young men who have committed themselves with great courage to share the gospel. Training starts in September after the heavy monsoons are over. All our young people are doing great in their studies.

We continue to look after destitute widows and the children in our daycare centres and our children's homes. All are very happy and safe!! Please pray for open doors for teams desiring to visit the ministry. The young evangelist will be paid \$50/month. It would be just great if the body would sponsor them and intercede as the Lord leads. Please also pray as Lorri and I and our leaders prepare to equip and train the young men to bring in the harvest. May you be greatly blessed!




I'm excitedly awaiting the Lord's plans for the future. His power within us enables Him to surpass all we can ask or imagine! Glory to God!

The Last event of the summer was our first JOLIM ladies conference where my wife Eva was the main speaker.




We are very thankful for the Lord to give us opportunities to serve Him. To see people coming to Christ

SUPERNATURAL CHURCH

Jesus made it very clear to His followers that He will build His Church!

"I will build My church, and the gates of Hades will not overcome it." (Matthew 16:18, NIV)

Two thousand years of Church history attest to this fact. Jesus declared that hell itself would not stop the advance of His kingdom on earth through His Church. But He also made it clear that it would be a fight—a struggle of kingdoms and the Church would advance at a cost.

"Since the days of John the Baptist until now, the kingdom of heaven has been forcefully advancing, and forceful men lay hold of it." (Matthew 11:12, NIV)

The kingdom of God advances with *force*! It is not passive in nature. The kingdom of God is aggressive. It has to be! Remember this fight is not against flesh and blood but against principalities and powers of the Spirit world (Ephesians 6:10-18).

This is why our weapons of warfare are not carnal (natural) but are spiritual and packed with 'divine power'. The strongholds we resist, and tear down are of a supernatural nature. We cannot fight them by natural means because we are not facing a natural kingdom. "The weapons we fight with are not the weapons of the world. On the contrary, they have divine power to demolish strongholds." (2 Corinthians 10:4, NIV)

The whole world is under the power of the devil. "As for you, you were dead in your transgressions and sins, in which you used to live when you followed the ways of this world and of the ruler of the kingdom of the air, the spirit who is now at work in those who are disobedient." (Ephesians 2:1-2, NIV)

Be assured this is not a natural power. His power is supernatural. That's why Jesus came. "How God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power, and how he went around doing good and healing all who were under the power of the devil because God was with him." (Acts 10:38, NIV)

Jesus walked in the power and authority of His kingdom by the Spirit within Him. He would destroy the works of Satan by the Spirit (1 John 3:8b). He did not work His ministry naturally—He was supernatural.

So how will He build His Church?

Jesus made it very clear that to rob the strong man (Satan) of his things you need to be stronger than him.

"When a strong man, fully armed, guards his own house, his possessions are safe. But when someone stronger attacks and overpowers him, he takes away the armor in which the man trusted and divides up the spoil." (Luke 11:21-22, NIV)

If Jesus said He will build His Church, and the gates of hell itself will not be able to withstand it, how is He building it?

The only way the Church can be built is SUPERNATURALLY!

There is no other way...

This is why the early Church needed the power of the Spirit then—and why we need the power of the Spirit today! Nothing has changed. To state otherwise is false doctrine!

"...stay in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high." (Luke 24:49, NIV)

The Church cannot afford to be merely a natural institution—it must be a supernatural organism (Acts 1:8).

The power referred to here is the Greek word 'dunamis'. This is a supernatural kingdom power—a dominion power.

It is a power that comes with the authority to govern and rule. The Apostolic faith was and is a *supernatural* faith. A supernatural Spirit-immersed church is the only answer. The message of Pentecost has not changed. It is the gift of the Father to the Church for all generations (Acts 2:38-39).

The Church that is led and empowered by the Spirit will come forth in this hour to fulfill its mandate. She will stand in the face of adversity and will be victorious. But she will do so forcefully—supernaturally—by the Spirit!

After February 1, 2024, there will be a late penalty of \$30.00 added to the \$210.00 = Total \$240.00.

Form 3 must be completed for all credential renewals and can be completed via hard copy and mail or online.

Hard copy forms must be sent your licensing or ordaining pastor/church with your cheque/money order. Your licensing or ordaining pastor/church <u>must sign off on your documents</u>. Your licensing or ordaining pastor/church will then forward your documents for processing.

Online renewal is available through www.iaogcan.com however, please consult with your licensing or ordaining pastor/church FIRST. The process must be completed WITH them.

If you complete Form 3 through our online renewal, please ensure you complete Step #2 for the online payment of your renewal fees.

For a minister 75 years of age and older your renewal fee is \$25.00. **NEW!** Please note this includes your annual convention fee. Please follow one of the options listed above for processing.


